
## ROCK SOLID EVIDENCE

The Roman governor, Pontius Pilate is famous for being the man who



allowed the Lord Jesus Christ to be crucified, despite declaring His innocence: "So Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowd, 'I find no fault in this Man." (Luke 23:4).

Recently archaeologists from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem turned their attention to an old copper ring from a royal palace, near Bethlehem, which



contains this man's name.

It is written

backwards (implying its use as a seal for documents), and the

simple inscription says 'PILATO' in Greek script, meaning 'belongs to Pilate.'



In the centre is a Jewishstyle wine flask, as used in Bible times.

The ring is a remarkable find which was uncovered back in the 1960s but only recently put forward for cleaning. Thanks to a new form of photographic imaging the inscription can be precisely seen and interpreted as belonging to this historical. Biblical character.

All this reminds us that the Bible is a book of history, not fiction. And that includes the events in the Gospels concerning the Lord Jesus. That is why we should take its message seriously today.
